The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Power Enterprise (SFPUC) is seeking candidates for two (2) 5602 Utility Specialists in Regulatory and Legislative Affairs. The SFPUC provides San Francisco City and County services with full electric service, including our International Airport, County Hospitals, and Municipal Transportation System, amounting to 150 MW of load, and we have growing responsibilities to serve redeveloped neighborhoods in San Francisco. The SFPUC also manages San Francisco's community choice aggregation program, which will offer renewable electricity supplies to San Francisco's residents and businesses.

A 5602 Utility Specialist in Regulatory and Legislative Affairs provides analytical and policy support on current energy regulatory, legislative and ratemaking matters that affect San Francisco's energy interests and the operations of the Power Enterprise of the SFPUC, and evaluates the impacts of existing and proposed regulations and legislation on the Power Enterprise and on San Francisco. Responsibilities include monitoring and participating in regulatory and legislative matters at federal, state, and local forums related to developing or acquiring renewable resources and energy efficiency programs; analysis of climate change and greenhouse gas regulations, renewable portfolio standards, and other regulatory and legislative changes; assessing the City's rights and ability to develop and deliver transmission and distribution services; fostering new load serving opportunities; and ensuring compliance with new regulatory and legislative requirements.

This position requires fundamental knowledge of electric sector regulation and ratemaking, current state and federal energy regulatory issues at the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) including familiarity with the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) and electricity markets; strong analytical skills and attention to detail; ability to conduct independent research and ability to synthesize and analyze large volumes of material and develop recommendations, both qualitatively and quantitatively; ability to communicate effectively both verbally and written, including preparation and delivery of reports, presentations, and memoranda.

The City and County of San Francisco promotes career growth opportunities and offers a competitive benefit package which includes flexible benefit plan including medical and dental insurance; Defined Benefit retirement plan; deferred compensation plan (457K); social security; life insurance; 11 paid holidays per year; 4 floating holidays; 10 to 20 vacation days per year depending on years of service; paid sick leave (13 days per year); and tuition reimbursement.
