The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Power Enterprise (SFPUC) provides San Francisco City and County with full electric service, including our International Airport, County Hospitals, and Municipal Transportation System, amounting to 150 MW of load, and we have growing responsibilities to serve redeveloped neighborhoods in San Francisco.

A Regulatory Specialist in Regulatory and Legislative Affairs provides analytical and policy support on current energy regulatory and ratemaking matters that affect San Francisco's energy interests including ongoing projects and operations such as monitoring and participating in legislative matters at federal, state, and local forums related to developing or acquiring renewable resources; assessing the City's rights to, or ability to develop electric transmission and distribution services; fostering new load serving opportunities; and ensuring compliance with new regulatory requirements. Essential duties include reviewing and analyzing testimony, reports, tariffs, rules, regulations, protocols, and white papers on energy issues and regulatory proceedings that have a direct or indirect impact on the SFPUC as an energy provider and the City as an energy consumer; participating at hearings, meetings, stakeholder groups, and regulatory forums in support of such energy interests; preparing summaries and briefings for dissemination of information and evaluation of requirements pursuant to legislation and regulatory filings or tariffs issued by regulatory and governing bodies, including but not limited to, the California Independent System operator (CAISO), the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), the California Energy Commission (CEC), the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAQMD), and the San Francisco Board of Supervisors.

This position requires fundamental knowledge of electric ratemaking, current state and federal energy regulatory issues at the CPUC and FERC; familiarity with the CAISO and electricity markets; ability to synthesize and analyze large volumes of material and communicate effectively both verbally and written.

The City and County of San Francisco promotes career growth opportunities and offers a competitive benefit package which includes flexible benefit plan including medical and dental insurance; Defined Benefit retirement plan; deferred compensation plan (457K); social security; life insurance; 11 paid holidays per year; 4 floating holidays; 10 to 20 vacation days per year depending on years of service; paid sick leave (13 days per year); and tuition reimbursement.
